

Probable Identification of Christina (Mrs. Albert) Lonsberry

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Introduction

In the process of reviewing DNA matches for the author's mother, "E*", a considerable number of matches with linked trees showing Lonsberry [*including variations*: Lounsberry, Lonsbury] ancestors were noted. This seemed interesting because the surname had never surfaced in decades of research into E*'s ancestry.

There were sixteen of these "Lonsberry" matches with extents of 20 cM¹ or more. Four of them are particularly close matches ranging from 98 cM to 188 cM; Ancestry.com groups them in the range of 3rd cousin – 4th cousin. These four closest Lonsberry matches were taken as a "focus group" for some extra attention:²

For actual third cousins we expect to find a common ancestor at the level of great-great grandparents, i.e. in the fourth generation of ancestors. In this discussion of DNA matches we may refer to that depth as the "research horizon" or just "horizon". Ideally, in the search for the MRCA (Most Recent Common Ancestor) of two persons with matching DNA we would research the family trees for both matches back to or beyond the indicated research horizon and just pick the matching person(s). If the extent of the DNA match is appropriate for that documented relationship we may then say that there is DNA evidence in support of the two tree constructions.

There are some complications. The horizon may differ between the matches, as more or fewer generations may have occurred in a given person's line. And if the tree(s) cannot be completed to the research horizon, then, even if *someone* does appear in both trees, some *other*, yet-unidentified ancestor(s) could be the actual MRCA(s). Ideally there is only one unknown and the gap occurs in only one of the two trees being compared. In that case the "problem" is actually a "solution": if the extent of the DNA match is appropriate for the implied relationship we may then say that there is DNA evidence in support of filling the unknown position in one tree with the known ancestor from the other. As will be shown later, with a bit of finessing this "Lonsberry" case actually approaches this ideal.

Using the matching persons' linked trees as a starting point, all four of the focus group matches can be traced to a Marcus D. Lonsberry (1828 – 1906) at a range varying from 4 generations to 6 on their own ancestry. It is apparent from available census records that this Marcus Lonsberry was born in Orange

County, New York³ and relocated to Fishkill, Dutchess County, New York⁴ sometime after the Civil War, living out his days and leaving his descendants there. This is intriguing because E* has a number of ancestors who were in the western part of Fishkill (now Beacon) New York in the 19th century and into the 20th; the family was there so recently that all of her older siblings were born in Beacon. But E*'s tree is nearly complete to the research horizon and there was no indication of how anyone named Lonsberry could fit in relation to her. The DNA matches were hinting at something unknown within the timespan that should be accessible to conventional, document-based family history research.

The DNA Relationship Prediction

The predicted relationship listed by Ancestry.com and noted above is a simplification. Ancestry users can also access more detailed information about the inferred relationship by clicking on the text that displays the extent of the match, to open a popup detailing "Possible DNA Relationships". The information listed on the popup includes more-detailed relationship groupings, each of which lists a percent "probability" and an associated list of several possible relationships making up the group. This arrangement reflects the fact that DNA matches cannot effectively distinguish between some relationships that entail a similar "genetic distance" between the two individuals.

For the most extensive match in the focus group, that is L* who matches E* in 11 segments totaling 188 cM, Ancestry.com's most likely relationship grouping is the one including 2nd cousin (2c) and 1st cousin once removed (1c1r), to which they assign a "probability" of 63%. The details for the several groups add up to a 94% likelihood that the relationship is closer than 3c. Match "D*" (176 cM, 8 segments) yields the same estimates; the match to "V*" (160 cM, 6 segments) indicates a 50% chance of a relationship in the category with 2c and 1c2r, and a 90% chance of a relationship closer than 3c. The fourth match in our focus group, "C*", matches E* at 98 cM, 3 segments and Ancestry's detailed estimates indicate a 48% chance of a closer-than-3rd-cousin relationship.

The general expectation is that a DNA match of a given extent should "predict" a relationship of some particular degree. In addition to Ancestry.com (and other testing operations), several independent efforts to come to terms with the predictions and predictive power of DNA have been undertaken. Among these is the *Shared cM Project*,⁵ which is made somewhat more approachable by the interactive tool provided by *DNA Painter*. Plugging the cM figures for our focus group into the interactive tool on *DNA Painter* gives the additional information shown in the table below.⁷ The online output is a table assigning a percent likelihood to each group in a list of groups of possible relationships. Within each group the expected amounts of shared DNA are the same, and so the tool (and DNA matching in general) cannot distinguish among the possibilities within the group. For example, 3C and 2C2R will be found grouped together, because they represent the same genetic distance. In the table, the P(3c) [that

is, probability of being 3rd cousins] column is the value the tool displays for the group that includes 3c as one of the possibilities. The *closer* and *further* columns sum the values that the tool displays in the rows listing relationships closer or further away than 3c, respectively. The totals of these three columns may differ slightly from 100% due to rounding. The last column is a sum of the *closer* and 3c columns, to show the probability of finding that the pair are third cousins or closer.

The data show that it is very likely that the first three matches in the focus group represent individuals whose relationships to E* are closer than third cousin. Roughly speaking, the fourth match is about equally likely to be a 3c, or closer, or more distant (though still most likely 3c or closer).

Initial Tree Comparison

E*'s tree has been researched conventionally to the extent that it is complete on the paternal line to the research horizon: all 8 of her paternal great-great grandparents are known. Also, about half of the next-older generation are known. On her maternal line, two of E*'s great-great grandparents are unknown, and a third is minimally identified. This condition would typically be understood to impair any attempt to derive evidence from DNA matches such as those in the focus group. But one of E*'s maternal-side first cousins, "N*", has also taken an AncestryDNA test and granted access to the match data. E* and N* share only one set of grandparents, and they do show a DNA match to each other of the expected extent for the known relationship between them. So, consideration of which DNA matches they share allows us to split E*'s tree and reduce by one-half the potential search space for her shared ancestors with the focus group. As it happens, N* does not share any of E*'s 16 noted Lonsberry matches. This indicates that E*'s MRCA (Most Recent Common Ancestor) with the Lonsberrys is to be found on her more-complete paternal side. So, in looking for E*'s MRCA with each of the focus group we can ignore E*'s maternal lineage entirely.

Considering E*'s paternal great-great-grandparents (2GGPs) as the "candidate group", we can note that all eight are known through research by their full names, and the lifespan dates and histories of six are well established. The other couple consists of man whose date of birth is unknown and whose date of death is estimated, and a woman whose date of birth is known to the month and whose date of death is bounded in a 7-year range.¹¹ All of the heirs of the woman in this couple are known from the settlement of an 1870 *division of property* lawsuit,¹² and it is clear that there is no link to the Lonsberrys there. There is a residual possibility that this man – William Henry White (d. ca 1845) – had a more complicated history that is unknown to us now, but this seems rather a slim possibility.

The candidate group includes just the four known couples, E*'s paternal GG-GPs. But (subject to the caveat above) research has identified with considerable confidence all of the children of those couples.

None are known to have married any Lonsberry. There is a little bit of unknown territory in later generations. In particular, details of later life are unknown here for a few of the children of E*'s GG-GF William Ives (1806 – 1853) by his second wife Charlotte Ann Bartley (b. 1827), including two daughters Sarah Ives (b. 16 Jan 1851) and Emma Ives (b. 28 Jul 1863). A number of online trees claim without evidence that Emma Ives married Elijah Lewis Scott in 1882 and died in 1900; no similar claims have been seen in connection with Sarah Ives. But overall, there appears to be almost no place for any previously unrecognized line of descent from the candidate group to the Lonsberrys. So, work from here proceeds with the understanding that something complicated may be going on.

Looking at the problem from the other side, we see that none of the focus group's linked trees are complete to the research horizon, although (as noted earlier) all four can trace their Lonsberry ancestry to one Marcus Lonsberry. The linked tree of each of the focus group matches does provide some information about the more recent generations. As this would be information about the match's own parents and grandparents it seems safe to assume that the details given are correct. Working independently from those details and using public information available on Ancestry.com, Newspapers.com, and the like, we have been able to fill in the ancestry of three of the four matches to the research horizon, or very nearly. In the process we have identified the exact relationship among the three and identified their MRCAs. We have no information on the maternal line of the fourth match, and one of the great-grandfathers also remains unidentified in the records available. This results in an extremely limited tree for the fourth match in our focus group (C*) and as a consequence the match was dropped from further consideration here.

In the process of working out the matches' trees, a relationship between E* and two of the three was discovered: one of their ancestors had been previously identified in document-based research as a 1c2r (first cousin, two times removed) of E*. The table below summarizes the work as it stood at this point.

This newly recognized relationship between E* and those two matches is interesting, but it is still far more distant than predicted by the DNA matches. Referring to the *Shared cM Project*, we see that the expected amount of shared DNA for a 3c1r or 3c2r is 27 cM and 13 cM, respectively. And the actual ranges of the data that the project has collected from volunteer participants reporting on documented matches falling in those two relationship groups run from 0 - 192 and 0 - 166, respectively. While the extreme high ends of the ranges may look comforting, the histograms provided in the detail writeup of the project show that the chances of such large matches resulting from the indicated relationship are extremely low. For instance, the relationship 3c2r falls in "Group 9", with a mean value in the actual submitted data of 35 cM and a standard deviation of 24; at about 6.4 standard deviations above the mean, a 188 cM match is an extreme outlier with a probability of less than 3% of actually belonging in that group.

This result shows that there is a complication. The relationship found by research is *real*, and it is reasonably likely to contribute *some* of the matching DNA. But it pertains to only 2 of the 3 remaining matches in the focus group, and it is extremely likely that it does not contribute *all* of the matching DNA for those two. It seems as if there must be another, more recent relationship as well.

Tree Comparison Revisited

The tree for D* seemed most convenient for detailed comparison. It shows that D*'s paternal grandparents, Vincent DiCastro and Mary DiPerno, were both born in Italy, in 1895 and 1899 respectively. There is no realistic possibility that the missing MRCA with E* is to be found on this branch, so consideration of D*'s tree is reduced to the match's maternal line. All four of the great-grandparents on that line had been identified, one of them initially by her married name only, that being Christina (Mrs. Albert A.) Lonsberry (born ca 1853). Three of the couples at the next generation, which is around the research horizon for this work, had also been identified. One of the three great-great grandmothers is known only by her married name and estimated dates: she was Ann J (Mrs. Richard) Ormerad, born ca 1825 in England, died 1880 – 1892 probably in New York. The 1880 census shows that she and both parents were born in England. On this basis our inability to fully identify her does not seem to be a problem for this analysis: it seems unlikely that our missing MRCA is lurking back in England, and also that lineage is shared by only two of the three matches in the focus group.

No common ancestor with E* was found on D*'s tree (incomplete at this stage) at the research horizon. Christina, Mrs. Albert A. Lonsberry, is D*'s ancestor for whom the parents at the research horizon remained unidentified. She first appeared in Fishkill, in the 1875 NY State census, as the 22-year-old (so, born around 1853) wife of Albert and (presumed) mother of 3-year-old William Lonsberry.

Because Christina sits in the only suitable gap to the research horizon we do seem to have evidence derived from the DNA match, showing that she should have a familial connection to E*. Christina was not a common name, and as it happens, research had previously made note of a Christina who was born around 1853 and who disappeared from the Ticehurst family in Fishkill (known ancestors of E*) between 1870 and 1875. In this light we undertook to research Christina "Ticehurst" and Christina, "Mrs. Albert A. Lonsberry" to determine if they were indeed the same person.

Christina, Christina

Here is the information drawn from records that pertain to Christina "Ticehurst" in the context of the Ticehurst family.

1. 1805, 1812. Elizabeth Lemmon, daughter of Leonard and Mercy, was christened at the Wesleyan Chapel at Rye, Sussex, England on 8 May 1812. The record gives her date of birth as 26 Mar 1805.¹³ The same date is listed for the birth of "Elizabeth Ticehurst" in William Ticehurst's Family Bible.¹⁴

2. 1825. William Ticehurst and Elizabeth Lemmon were married at Ore, Sussex on 14 Feb 1825.¹⁵ The first entry in William Ticehurst's Family Bible, *Marriages* page gives his name (bride not named) and the same date.
3. 1848 – 1855. William Ticehurst's Family Bible, *Births*, records consecutively (in sequence with earlier and later entries) "Albert Ticehurst Novr 30 1848", "Sarah E Ticehurst June 26 185[5?]", "Frederic Ticehurst Aug 6 1857 [the last digit written over an earlier figure, possibly an 8]". Sarah's death certificate confirms her birth date as June 26, 1855 and names her parents William Ticehurst and Ann Ives.¹⁶
4. 1850. William Ticehurst and family enumerated in Fishkill in the census; William Ticehurst age 50, baker, born England; Eliza [ditto] age 44 born England; and five children down to the youngest, Albert, age 1.¹⁷
5. 1850. William Ives and family enumerated in Fishkill.¹⁸ His daughter Ann Ives (known as such from multiple later records) was not in his household; nor is there any enumeration to be found of her in that name.
6. 1854. William Ticehurst's first wife died: from William Ticehurst Family Bible, *Deaths*, "Eliza my wife Died Augt 28 1854".
7. 1860. Christina listed in the census in the Fishkill household of William Ticehurst, as Christina "do" [ditto: Ticehurst], age 5, born " [ditto: NY].¹⁹ Christina is not listed in William Ticehurst's Family Bible: not in births, marriages, or deaths.
8. 1863. Ann, wife of William Ticehurst, is named as a daughter of William Ives in the probate papers for his estate.²⁰
9. 1865. Listed in the census in the Fishkill household of William Ticehurst, as Christina Ticehurst [spelled out], his "daughter", age 12, born Mass.²¹ This entry shows "2" for number of times married for head-of-household William Ticehurst and for his wife Ann M Ticehurst.

Shanley. Births, Marriages, Deaths: handwritten entries with dates from 1800, with the earliest ones evidently written circa 1830 by William Ticehurst himself.

10. 1870. Listed in the census in the household of William Ticehurst, as “– [dash, meaning ditto: Ticehurst], Christa”, age 16, birthplace “–“ [ditto: New York], “works in rubber fact[ory]”.²²
11. 1871. William Ticehurst died, 14 November.²³
12. 1875. The William Ticehurst household is listed in Fishkill, with William age “75” listed as head of household [despite the fact that he was actually deceased; he *would have been* 75 years old had he lived], with his wife Ann, etc.; Christina was not listed in the household.²⁴
13. 1892. Ann Ticehurst and 2 children, Ida and Henry, listed in Fishkill in the 1892 New York Census.²⁵
14. 1894. The widow Ann (Ives) Ticehurst died in Fishkill (Matteawan or Fishkill Landing), 23 June 1894, age 65-1-1.²⁶

Christina “Ticehurst” was listed in the censuses of 1860, 1865, and 1870 [items 7, 9, 10] as if she were the daughter of William Ticehurst. But other information – notably the facts that are, and are not, listed in William Ticehurst’s Family Bible [items 1, 6, 7] – shows that almost certainly she was not his (biological) child. Christina is not listed among the births in William Ticehurst’s Bible, even though it lists all of his other known children, including one who was born and died in England years before the particular Bible was printed. The censuses suggest Christina was born in 1853, 1854, or 1855. William Ticehurst’s first wife was 47 years old in 1853 [items 1, 2, 4]; that would be unusually late for her to have a child. The most recent previous birth listed in William Ticehurst’s Family Bible is that of Albert in 1848 [item 3], when Eliza was 43. That would be a more typical age for a woman’s last child.

William Ticehurst did not write the date of his second marriage, but it is clear that his second wife was born Ann Ives [item 8] and that it was her second marriage as well [item 9]. In combination with the census records [items 7, 9, 10] it seems to be practically certain that Christina was the daughter of Ann (Ives) (-) Ticehurst by her first husband, whose name is entirely unknown from the records on this side. As noted, those same census records place Christina’s birth in the period 1853 – 1855 and place her birth in Massachusetts or New York.

Christina “vanished” from the Ticehurst family between the censuses of 1870 and 1875 [10, 12]. No record in her name after 1870 – no entry in the Family Bible, no marriage in a church, no gravestone, etc. – has been found.

Here is the information drawn from records that pertain to Christina, Mrs. Albert A. Lonsberry.

15. 1870. [Lonsberry], Albert A, age 20, born [New York], occupation “works in hat-shop”, listed in the Fishkill household of Mar[ius?] Lonsberry, age 42, occupation “pilot”. Two other Lonsberrys in the family, Amanda J age 41 and Sarah C age 18.²⁷
16. 1875. Enumerated at Fishkill, Marcus Lonsberry, age 47, occupation “H. R. Pilot” at “Fishkill Ferry”, with “wife”²⁸ Amanda Lonsberry age 46 and “daughter” Kate Lonsberry age 22.²⁹
17. 1875. Christine Lonsbury listed in Fishkill in 1875 New York State census, born Rensselaer County, age 22, wife of Albert; with one son of head-of-household Albert (and, presumably, also her son), namely William, age 3. Albert’s occupation was listed as “works in hat shop”.³⁰
18. 1880. Christine Lonsberry listed in Fishkill in census, wife of Albert, age 24, born Massachusetts, both parents born NY, with (Albert’s) sons Willie age 8, Marcus age 3, Joseph age 2, all three born New York, father born NY, mother born Mass. Albert’s occupation “wks in hat shop”.³¹
19. 1886. Harry A Lonsberry, grandson of Marcus and presumed to be the son of Albert and Christina, born at “Beacon” in June.³²
20. 1890. Bertha Lonsberry, apparently the last child of Albert and Christina, was born in New York (State), either in 1889 (marriage record)³³ or 15 Sep 1890 (GSI).³⁴
21. 1891. Listed in Deaths in Bridgeport in city directory, Lonsberry Christina, Feb 28, age 29.³⁵

25. 1905. Married in the Town of Montague, Massachusetts, Olive J Atkins, age 18, and Arthur Lonsberry, age 24, birthplace Fishkill on the Hudson, son of Albert Lonsberry and Christina "Tycurs", 1 Apr 1905.³⁹
26. 1913. Married at Co. Bluffs, Iowa, Aug 23, 1913, George F Helgeson age 23 and Bertha Lonsberry, age 24, born New York, parents Albert Lonsberry and Christina Cheney.⁴⁰
27. 1934. An obituary transcribed on FindAGrave reports the death of William Charles Lonsberry at Middletown, New York on 01 Feb 1934 and states that "Mr. William Charles Lonsberry was born in Beacon, New York...January 9, 1870 .. to Albert and Christine Cherry Lonsberry".⁴¹
28. 1948. An obituary transcribed on the memorial for Marcus D. Lonsberry states that he "was born August 17, 1877, son of Albert Lonsberry and Christine Cherry Lonsberry".⁴²

The census for the “Marius” Lonsberry household in 1870 [item 15] and those for Marcus and Albert in 1875 [items 16, 17] are consistent with Albert Lonsberry being single in his father’s household in 1870 and married in his own by 1875. We might be concerned that the younger woman in the 1870 census was actually Albert’s wife, but the 1875 census shows that she (Catherine / Kate) was Marcus’s daughter and thus Albert’s sister.

The censuses in which Mrs. Albert Lonsberry appears, 1875 and 1880 list her given name as “Christine” [items 15, 18]. However, the city directory shows that Albert was resident in Bridgeport in 1891 [item 22] when his wife died there [items 21, 23]; so, presumably Albert supplied the information on record at Bridgeport and more weight should be given to it. Her name is shown as “Christina” in both the city directory and the vital records of Bridgeport. So, we accept that her given name was actually “Christina”.

Those same two censuses indicate that Mrs. Christin[a] Lonsberry was born 1853 – 1856 in Massachusetts or in Rensselaer County, New York. The congruence with Christina “Ticehurst” is notable for the similarity of date range and place range.

The record of Mrs. Christina Lonsberry’s death in the Bridgeport VR [item 23] provides some information that is distinct or unique to this source. It gives her maiden name, “Cherry”, and it provides the given names of her parents – Ford and Ann. It lists specific birthplaces for all three, stating that Christina and her father were both born at Matteawan (an industrial village then within the Town of Fishkill and now part of the City of Beacon) and that her mother was born at “Tironda”. Clearly this last is a reference to Tioronda, which is the name given to a region around the mouth of the Fishkill Creek, then part of the Town of Fishkill, now also part of Beacon, and formerly called Byrnesville. Even though the mother’s surname is omitted in the record at Bridgeport, identification of Christina’s mother as a woman named Ann from this specific locality quite narrows the field. As shown in other work, Ann Ives’ grandfather Joseph Ives⁴⁴ lived in Byrnesville from around the year 1800, adjacent to William Byrnes in a small property split off from the extensive grounds of the Byrnes Mill. And Ann’s father William Ives had an interest in property there at least into the 1850s.⁴⁵

It seems clear enough that the Albert Lonsberry who appears briefly at Bridgeport in 1891 was, surely, the same man we know from Fishkill. The name was not all that common, and the occupation is also a match, and so is the given name of his wife, and so is the evident connection to the Fishkill area through her. Although Albert is found in Fishkill in 1880 and 1900, a temporary relocation to find work in his industry would not be unusual, and the Bridgeport directories show that he was there only for a short time.

Still, there are several areas of conflicting information that need to be considered and resolved. First, that record in the Bridgeport VR does not give a date of birth for Christina, but it does give her age as 29-11-22, from which her calculated date of birth would be 06 Mar 1861. This is in conflict with the census records; the resolution here is to take it that this entry is incorrect, probably due to an error of arithmetic. First, it is implausible to suppose that Albert Lonsberry's wife in Bridgeport was a different Christina from his wife in Fishkill. If that was true and the date of birth accurate, we would expect to probably find a record of the death of the supposed first Mrs. Christina Lonsberry after the census date in 1880, and to find an unmarried Christina, last name unknown, age 19, in the 1880 census and age 14 in 1875, and probably to find a record of the supposed second marriage. None of those records have been found. Second, the 1875 census shows Christine (Christina) married and with a child age 3; if born in 1861 she would have married at the age of 10 and borne the child at 11, which is effectively impossible. It appears quite reasonable to disregard as errant the given age and the implied birth date for Christina, and altogether unreasonable to accept the data.

There is also a conflict raised by the assertion in the obituary of William Charles Lonsberry that he was born to Albert and Christina "January 9, 1870" [item 27]. In 1870 Christina was still listed as a Ticehurst in the household of William Ticehurst, and this might seem to weigh against the identification. But, as we have seen, Albert was not with any wife, Christina or otherwise, in mid-1870. Instead he was in his father's household in that census and evidently unmarried, and the infant William Charles Lonsberry, who would have been almost six months old if that obituary transcript is correct, does not appear. So, we can and do dismiss this conflict as simply an error in the stated year of 1870. Whether the error is in the printed obituary or in the transcript is not known here.

There are also conflicts in the information in different sources regarding the maiden name of Mrs. Christina Lonsberry. The marriage records of two of the children of Albert and Christina Lonsberry each give her a different maiden name, and each differs from the "Cherry" given in the VR at Bridgeport. In the earlier of the two, the marriage of Arthur T. Lonsberry in 1905, her name is listed as Christina Tyc[u]rs⁴⁶ [item 25]. In the later record, of the marriage of Bertha Lonsberry in 1913, the name of her mother appears to have been written as "Christina Cheney" [item 26].

As for the "Cheney / Cherry" conflict, note that multiple obituaries of her children give Christina's name as "Cherry" [e.g. items 27, 28, 29] and apparently none have it as "Cheney". And the register in which that 1913 marriage is listed surely contains transcripts, not original certificates, and one can see that a hand-written "Cherry" could easily be mis-read and mis-transcribed as "Cheney". On this basis we take the name to have been "Cherry" and discard the conflicting "Cheney".

The conflicting name in Arthur's Lonsberry's 1905 marriage record is far more interesting. The name "Christina Tycurs" has no apparent context within the Lonsberry family. But if we say the name "Tycers" aloud followed by "Ticehurst", it is intuitively obvious that they sound the same. And this is easily verified by the Soundex code: they have the same encoding, T262.⁴⁷ As we have already discussed,

there was a woman in Fishkill called Christina Ticehurst but whose surname at birth is not known from any record found in research on the Ticehurst family. The obvious best explanation is the one that is consistent with the DNA evidence: that Mrs. Christina Lonsberry – who first appeared in 1875, in Fishkill, evidently having borne a child about 1872 – was the same person as Miss Christina Ticehurst – who disappeared from Fishkill after 1870.

It seems quite reasonable to suppose that if that is correct then the children of Albert and Christina Lonsberry would have been acquainted with the name “Ticehurst” through contact with their grandmother of that name. Ann (Ives) Ticehurst lived in Beacon up to the time of her death in 1894 [items 13, 14]. It is true that the Lonsberrys were away in Connecticut in 1891, but they only appear in the city directory there for that single year. And they were in Fishkill in 1880, [item 18] when the family appears in the census and son Arthur was born there. They were still there in 1886, when son Harry was born in “Beacon” [item 19]. And they were (or at least, Christina was) evidently still in the area in 1890, for the birth of (last?) child Bertha Lonsberry in September of that year [item 20]. After their brief stint in Bridgeport in 1891, Albert and at least some of his children had returned to Fishkill by 1892 [item 24]. Arthur himself, the middle child of Albert and Christina Lonsberry, was almost 14 years old when Ann (Ives) Ticehurst died. All of this shows that contact between the Lonsberry children and their grandmother Ann Ticehurst would have been quite possible and that would be a reason for them to associate the name Ticehurst with their mother. The fact that Albert gave the maiden name of his mother as “Tycers” for no other apparent reason is strong evidence that there was such a connection and that the inference of Christina’s identity is correct.

We suppose from the information available that Christina was born in 1853 or a little later, so it is not surprising that she is not to be found in the 1850 census. But Ann Ives was out of her father’s household by the time of the 1850 census and is likely to have been married prior. Searching the 1850 census for an Ann Cherry, age 21, and a husband named “Ford Cherry” turns up only one record that bears any resemblance to expectations and we take it to be a likely match.

30. 1850. Enumerated in Fishkill, Floyd Cherry, age 29, occupation: carder, born New York, with Ann [ditto: Cherry], age 20, born New York and Albert E. [ditto: Cherry], age 5/12, born New York.⁴⁸

Ann Ives would have turned 21 a few days before the enumeration date in 1850; the age difference of one year from the census record is not significant. Her birthplace (New York) is a match, and so is the married name (Ann Cherry). The given name of the man, “Floyd”, is not quite a match for the expected “Ford”, but it is “pretty close”, and search (by index) finds nobody actually named “Ford Cherry” in 1850.⁴⁹ This “Floyd Cherry” is the only good candidate adult male in the entire 1850 census that can be found using a wildcard search with “F*” for his first name.⁵⁰ There is no later record of this family – none for any of the three names. And we know that Ann Ives’ first husband had died prior to 1855, when she remarried. Whatever his given name was, we can thus say that Christina’s natural father had

died by 1855 when Albert Lonsberry was still an infant or toddler. So, Albert Lonsberry would never have met his wife's father, and it would not be surprising for him to have had the name not-quite-right in 1891, recalling it as "Ford" rather than "Floyd". Or perhaps Albert had the name right, and it is the census itself that has an error. It does seem reasonable to accept this census record as quite probably being that of Christina's parents.

We do, however, need to point out that there is a bit of evidence against this view. We note the 5-month-old Albert E [Cherry] in that 1850 enumeration and suppose that it is extremely likely that he was the child of the adult female, Ann. This Albert E. Cherry does not appear in later census records and we suppose that he died prior to 1860. But that raises yet another conflict, this time with the information in the 1865 census for the William Ticehurst household. That return lists four younger Ticehursts after Ann: Christina Ticehurst (12), Sarah E Ticehurst (9), Frederick Ticehurst (7), and Albert Ticehurst (3).⁵¹ The latter three are all listed in the *Births* in William Ticehurst's Family Bible, and Ann is named as their mother on the death certificates of all three. When we add the presumably deceased Albert E. Cherry to the four shown in the 1865 census listing, we suppose that by the time of that census Ann had born five children, though only four of them were still living. But the figure given next to her name in column 11, "Of how many children the parent", is 4, not 5.⁵² If our construction of the family is correct, this should have been "5": according to the instructions intended for enumerators of that census (emphasis in original):

11. *Of how many children the parent.* This inquiry is to be made only of adult females, and usually of wives or widows. It should, in all cases, include the number of living children the woman has borne, *whether now living or dead, and whether present or absent* from the family.⁵³

In construing the Floyd Cherry family as representing Christina's birth parents we must simply set aside this conflict of evidence. We have no explanation to offer, beyond supposing that they got it wrong in 1865: either the enumerator did not follow the instructions, or the informant did not know of (or did not at that moment recall) the lost Albert E. Cherry. This explanation does seem quite plausible. Yet there remains a small measure of doubt introduced by the inconsistency.

Where Was Christina Born?

Records for both phases of Christina's life "agree to disagree": she was born in New York, or she was born in Massachusetts. The records from her married life are more specific but still conflicted as to the place, if in New York: she was born in Matteawan (Fishkill), or she was born in Rensselaer County.

Obviously, Christina was not born in both New York and Massachusetts, nor in both Matteawan and Rensselaer County, so some of these facts must be mistaken. Still, it is common for errors to have a kernel of truth. A mis-stated birthplace may arise from a connection to the said place other than the person's actual birth: perhaps she lived there as a young child, or perhaps her parents were from there.

We see the couple that we think were probably Christina's parents in Fishkill in the census of 1850. That might be where Christina was born, but it could instead, quite easily, be the source of a mistaken statement of her birthplace. It is much harder to explain away the references to Massachusetts, which are found in both phases of Christina's life. Massachusetts is pretty wide, but part of it adjoins New York, and part of that border runs along the New York county of Rensselaer. Christina may or may not have been literally born in that area, but it certainly seems that the towns on either side of that stretch of border merit special attention, in looking for records of the Cherry family.

From south to north, the towns in Rensselaer County, New York on the Massachusetts border are Stephentown, Berlin, and Petersburg. On the Massachusetts side there are just two towns, they are in Berkshire County: from south to north, Hancock and Williamstown. Records in those town of anyone named Cherry from around 1850 would clearly be of potential interest in connection with Christina.

The closest such record found so far relates that a three-year-old infant surnamed Cherry died in nearby Adams, Massachusetts on 7 Oct 1853. The child's given name, sex, birthplace, and parents' names were all omitted from the record.⁵⁴ Perhaps this is a record of our lost Albert E. Cherry; perhaps not. There do not seem to be any other relevant records of anyone of the name in or near this border area in the right time. Still, descendants of Christina's might wish to search this region with more diligence.

Summary

With varying degrees of confidence, the life of Christina, Mrs. Albert Lonsberry, can now be described:

- She was born between about 1853 and 1855, possibly in Matteawan (Fishkill, NY) or possibly on one side or the other of the border between Rensselaer County, New York and Berkshire County, Massachusetts.
- Her mother was Ann M Ives (1829 – 1894), daughter of William and Mary Ann (Lane) Ives, who married second William Ticehurst (1800 – 1871) by mid-1855.
- Her father was probably Floyd [or, Ford] Cherry, born in New York around 1821, worker in a mill as a carder, died prior to 1855.
- She was raised in Matteawan by her mother and her stepfather, William Ticehurst. She would have lived in the Ticehurst household (bakery), which we note in other work is shown at the corner of Spring Street and Spring Valley Street on an 1854 map.
- She married Albert Lonsberry around 1871. Between 1872 and 1890 they had seven children that we know of, all born in New York.
- Christina died in Bridgeport, Connecticut in 1891. It is likely that her husband Albert had just moved there in pursuit of employment.

Genealogical Summary

This lineage report has been computer-generated from a database and only lightly edited by hand. It presents essential information to show the connection between the Cherry / Lonsberry line and other Ives descendants. Additional details and evidence, as well as any newer information as it becomes available, may be found in the online tree.

The earliest Ives ancestor on this line who is known with any confidence at this time (December 2020) is Joseph Ives. A “popular” misconception (found on many online trees) is to misplace his son William Ives (1806 – 1863) as the son of Elam Ives of Hamden, Connecticut. Elam Ives did have a son William, but that William Ives lived out his own, well-documented life in New Haven, Connecticut, and certainly he was not the man who lived at Fishkill.

In this section footnote numbers are distinguished by square brackets [] around the number. Superscript numbers without brackets are generation numbers (counting from Joseph Ives as¹) per the register format convention.
